Emmanuel Faber is trailblazer for sustainable food practices and responsible capitalism. He is passionate about improving the nutritional quality of food, restoring biodiversity and using business as a force for social justice.

Faber transformed Danone into a world leading corporation in environmental, social and governance (ESG), restructuring the company's business model around sustainable practices. This included introducing climate adjusted earnings reports, investing heavily in reducing plastic and shifting the company's legal status to an *Entreprise à Mission* – a move that made Danone the first listed corporation in French history to enshrine its purpose in law.

Under Faber, Danone also acquired White Wave, the world's largest organic food and

vegetal protein alternatives producer, and launched a series of initiatives promoting economically and environmentally sustainable agriculture practices.

In 2019, Faber initiated mass-scale industry-wide cooperation to protect the planet, launching the One Planet Business for Biodiversity (OP2B) coalition at the UN's Climate Action Summit. This group consists of 21 of the world's largest food and agri-based companies who are all shifting their business models to protect biodiversity and promote regenerative farming practices.

He is also a Chair of the G7/OECD coalition Business for Inclusive Growth, and a member of The B Team, the business and civil society collective that works to create new norms for corporate leadership and pushes for measures of success to include the health of people and the planet alongside financial performance.
